Dear Families,

Welcome to Term 4! It has been outstanding to see our students return from their holiday break refreshed and eager to engage back at school, ready for a fun and productive term ahead.

Last week, we sent out an electronic survey home to families to support the class placement processes for next year. Thank you to the families who have already completed the survey, with a friendly reminder that the survey will only be available up until the end of this week (Friday, October 25<sup>th</sup>). During Term 4, our staff will put a significant amount of time and careful consideration into each child for their class allocation for next year. When deciding on class structures, it is worth mentioning that we endeavour to ensure that each classroom has an equal distribution of student needs and abilities, regardless of it being a composite or straight year level. As part of the placement process, each student will identify four peers that they consider as positive learning friends. Teachers will make every effort to ensure that at least one of these friends is accommodated, whilst also making allowances for students to make new connections with new peers that they may not have worked with in the past. Student input is triangulated with teacher judgment on observations of group dynamics, and parent requests (where possible) to make the best fit. The good news is, that if your child's close friend is not in the same classroom, they will not have to travel too far during play break times to find one another.

Term 4 is an exciting time for our students, with a host of extra-curricular events. Before we know it, the Christmas break will be upon us! Thank you to all the families for students in Years 3-6 who have returned camp notes already. Please see your child's class teacher or a member of the Front Office should you require any further information regarding the upcoming student camps or extra-curricular activities.

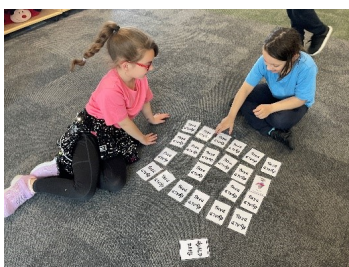
## RAZZTWIZZLERATHON
