## **Reading Improvement Priority**

Our Site Improvement Plan aims for reading growth and improvement for every student and as such, reading is a high priority in each classroom at our school.

At our staff meeting this week, classroom teachers shared details of their reading programs and evidence of student progress. We heard descriptions of the rich and explicit teaching of reading strategies and the ongoing assessment of individual student progress

which informs next teaching steps.

The Junior Primary teachers shared progress of their trial of the Heggerty approach which involves daily phonemic and phonological awareness sessions. This enhances the existing implementation of the Jolly Phonics program.

Primary teachers shared evidence of student learning with a focus on targeted reading strategies including inferencing, visualising and interpreting explicit information.

Middle School teachers shared their use of an assessment and teaching resource called Probe which enables teachers to ascertain which reading strategies need strengthening for each student and further enables the tracking of individual and cohort progress.

PREDICT
Octermine what you think will happen in the text. Use the title, text, and illustrations to help you.

VISUALIZE
Create mental images of the characters, settings, and events in the text.

QUESTION
Stop and ask yourself questions to see if the text makes sense. Reread the text if you need more information.

CONNECT
Think about what you already know about the text. Find ways to relate the text to yourself, other texts, and the world around you.

IDENTIFY
Use clues in the text and your own knowledge to fill in the gaps and draw conclusions.

EVALUATE
Think about the text as a whole and form opinions about what you read.

**Frequently Asked Questions** 

Can classes have class parties again? And can, birthday cakes be shared?

In line with SA Health advice, communal sharing of food is currently not permitted. Class parties can only therefore proceed with individually served or wrapped items. Likewise, birthday cakes (or any home baked goods) unfortunately cannot be shared.

### Why do our students change Sportsday teams each year?

Our Sports day aims for maximum participation of students in tabloid events. To participate in tabloid events, each class requires an even mix of students in each of the 5 teams. That is, each class needs approximately 5 students in red, 5 in blue, 5 in green etc.

If students were to stay fixed in a team, classes would most likely have uneven numbers of students in teams when new classes are formed at the beginning of each year. This would make our current format unworkable.

## Vacation Care Program












# YEAR 7 TO HIGH SCHOOL



## Parent Update

Week 10, Term 1 - 2021

### Preparing for year 7 in high school in 2022

We know many families of our year 6 and 7 students are busy exploring their local high school options for 2022.

Next year will be unique, with a double cohort of students starting high school together as they enter years 7 and 8. The once-only move is necessary as we move year 7 to high school in public schools across the state.

Our primary and high schools are working together at every level to ensure the move is successful for families. Here are some of the key benefits to your child beginning high school in Year 7.

### Learning opportunities

All South Australian students learn the Australian Curriculum, which was designed for year 7s to be taught in high school, as it is interstate. High school settings provide more specialist facilities to enhance learning, such as science laboratories, performing arts spaces and kitchens. They also offer teachers who are subject-specific experts, and a wide variety of extra-curricular activities.

### A nation-wide move

Moving our year 7 students into high school brings South Australia in line with other states. Queensland and Western Australia most recently made the move in 2015. It also aligns our public school system with the Catholic and independent school sectors, which also teach year 7 in high school. Taking a cohesive approach to the start of high school promotes equity and makes it easier to move between states and school sectors, should you need to do so.

### Year 7s are ready for high school

We know from the experiences of schools interstate and from our own pilot schools that year 7s are well and truly ready for high school. This finding has been reinforced by the pilot program run through the Department for Education, involving three high schools, which welcomed their first cohort of year 7 students last year. We have been tracking the students' progress through interviews and surveys. The vast majority have enjoyed making new friends, trying new sports and activities and learning in a more mature environment.

### We are ready for the move


Planning is well underway to ensure the move of year 7 to high school is well-managed and considered. We are drawing on our pilot program insights and what we have learnt from Queensland and Western Australia to ensure the move is as smooth as possible.
