Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. What a difference a week can make! Our students have adapted to change once again in a very short amount of time showing great resilience.

Camp is an absolute highlight for students, so I'm sure you're wondering what will happen with your child's camp, if they missed it due to lockdown in Week 1 or they were scheduled to go in Week 4 or 5. All of our decisions about camp, are based on the directives given by the Department for Education. Currently, we have been asked to postpone all camps for the remainder of this week and for Week 3.

At this stage, we have not cancelled the Week 4 and 5 camps. Wirraway Homestead are keeping those dates secured in the hope that guidelines are relaxed next week, allowing for us to attend.

If you have not paid for your child's camp, please hold off until we've confirmed it will go ahead. If the camp goes ahead and you missed the due date that was on the original consent forms, it does not mean your child will miss out.

If you have paid and the camp gets cancelled, you will be notified about credit or refund options.

We are always disappointed when we need to postpone or cancel camps, feeling saddened for our students. We are in the process of rebooking a camp for the students that missed out last week, Wednesday – Friday due to the lockdown, and further possible dates, if we need to postpone Weeks 4 and 5.

MASKS ARE REQUIRED

All adults must wear a mask while indoors and in the presence of other adults at this school.

Masks are not required while eating or drinking or while outside.

Masks are not required for adults when teaching or engaging with students.



Wash and dry (or sanitise) your hands before you put on your mask.



Make sure your mask completely covers your nose, mouth and chin.



Try not to touch, or adjust, the front of your mask while wearing it.



Do not allow the mask to hang around your neck, or sit under your nose.



Responsibly dispose of single-use masks in the bin. **Do not put into recycling.**



Wash and dry (or sanitise) your hands after removing the mask.



Masks are not required for students or staff who have a medical condition, such as problems with their breathing, a serious skin condition on the face, a disability, or a mental health condition.





Secondary School Enrolment Offers

This term enrolment offers for secondary school will be sent to the families of our year 6 and 7 students. It is important for you to know that not all schools will send out their enrolment offers at the same time, but they will be sent as close as possible to 13 August 2021.

Most families will receive their offer via email. If you think you have not received your enrolment offer from your secondary school, you need to check your junk folder for an email from education.noreply@sa.gov.au.

If you did not provide an email address on your Registration of Interest form, you will receive your enrolment offer in the mail or it will be handed to you by your child.

If your enrolment offer has not arrived by 18 August, please let the front office know on 8289 3137 and we can follow up with the secondary school on your behalf.

If you need support to accept your enrolment offer, it is best to contact your allocated secondary school and they can step you through the process.
