Year 6 & 7 Graduations

SITE IMPROVEMENT PLAN PRIORITIES

Each year we analyse our student learning results and make plans for new school improvement goals and targets for the coming year. Reading and Maths have been our priorities for the past three years and we are very pleased to share the following results with you.

Reading results according to NAPLAN testing indicate:

An increase in the number of students achieving in the <u>high bands</u> in Year 3 and Year 5 (a 1% decrease in Year 7)


An increase in students achieving <u>at standard</u> in Years 5 & 7 (a 1% decrease at Year 3)

Maths results according to NAPLAN testing indicate:

An increase in the number of students achieving in the <u>high bands</u> in Year 3 and Year 5 (a 2% decrease in Year 7; however Year 7 percentages are already above our historic average)

An increase in students achieving <u>at standard</u> in Years 5 & 7 (a 1% decrease at Year 7)

And, Maths results according to PAT-M testing indicate that between 2018 and 2021, the average growth in achievement for our students at every year level increased. On the graph below, the red lines indicate the growth within one year (from 2017 to 2018) for each year level cohort. The blue lines indicate growth from 2020 to 2021 depicting not only higher scores but stronger one-year growth overall.



CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY

Congratulations to our 2021 Children's University Graduates!

These 43 students pursued a minimum of 30 (out of school) hours, dedicated to learning in a variety of ways. Activities included sport, music, arts and crafts plus endless online options through the University portal. Visits to museums, galleries and learning destinations were possible this year with restrictions being eased.

SAPSASA Basketball

On Friday 29th of October, the Golden Grove Year 6 boys basketball team attended the SAPSASA Basketball Championship Final at Mt. Barker. This competition featured the 14 best teams from the state who had previously qualified 1st or 2nd on the qualifying days.

We were in a tough division with some elite basketball programs, players and coaches. In the heats we won 4 out of 7 games, losing 3 games by small margins to Whitefriars, Prince Alfred College and Eastern Fleurieu.



We qualified 4th in our heat which allowed us to play for the 7th position overall. Playing Glen Osmond in the playoff was exciting and nerve racking. At the final siren we were up by 2 points but we committed a foul with seconds remaining so Glen Osmond had two shots from the free throw line. Fortunately for us, both shots missed.

SAPSASA Cricket

On Friday 22nd of October, we sent 2 teams to the SAPSASA Cricket Carnival. We had a girls and boys team and each team could have 8 on the field. They bat in pairs and each player gets a bowl. The boys started off well, winning their first game by 57 runs. They lost their second game by 37 runs, won the third game by 70 runs and lost the last game to Wynn Vale by 10 runs, finishing 4th overall.
